History

Established in 1983, the goal of Nature Camp at Chapultepec Farm has been to help children understand through observation, enjoy through discovery, and appreciate through personal involvement.

Chapultepec Farm is the home of Jimmy Timberlake and Gina Farrar and is located just outside of the Town of Warrenton near Orlean. The property which is in a conservation easement, includes a mile-long Rappahannock River frontage, including a ford originally surveyed by George Washington, as well as open fields, a pond, streams and woodland for endless varieties of wildlife.

Program

Campers are encouraged to explore their surroundings, develop their awareness of our natural world, and learn about the interrelationship of all living things. Pond, stream and river life, field and woodland ecology, and crafts and games will be introduced in an informal non competitive atmosphere. Children will be encouraged to explore and discover these natural surroundings.

Transportation

Transportation is the responsibility of the parents. Carpooling is recommended and a list of campers with contact information can be provided to assist in this effort.

Enrollment

Enrollment is limited to 24 children, whose ages correspond with students entering grade 3rd through 6th grades, approximately 8 yrs. – 11 yrs old. There will be one counselor for every 6 children. In addition, junior counselors, many of whom attended Nature Camp in years past, will also be on hand to help with activities.

Equipment and Clothing

The program is active and primarily outdoors. Clothing should be comfortable, practical, well-worn, and suitable for the weather. Campers should bring their own lunch and beverages. A mid-morning snack is suggested. Please, think healthy, both for your child and the environment. In addition, campers will need the following in their backpack each day:



- writing utensils
- bathing suit and towel (one piece only for girls)
- extra socks
- whistle
- bandana

Everything should be in zip-top bags, including lunch, and fit in the backpack for portability.
